School History

Upper Bucks Christian School is a mission of Bethel Baptist Church and was founded in September 1968 with a kindergarten class of twelve students. By September 1975, an entire K–12 program was offered and the first graduation ceremony occurred in 1976 with nine graduating seniors. Today, approximately 300 Preschool–12th grade students attend classes where they receive a Christian education with all subject matters being taught from a Biblical worldview. With the 2024 graduating class, we will reach almost 1100 graduates, and we are thrilled to continue to see graduates of UBCS serving the Lord around the world in various vocations.

Administration

The Upper Bucks Christian School Board is responsible for praying for the school, providing the school vision, and seeking the improvement and advancement of the mission of UBCS. The school administration is responsible to work with the school board and to oversee the day-to-day activities of the school. School leadership consists of an Administrator, Assistant Administrator, Daycare Director, Director of Student Advancement, Guidance Counselor and divisional lead teachers. These positions exist to provide for a smooth operation of the school.

General Information

- A Biblical worldview is integral in the teaching of each subject.
 - Teachers provide a positive, productive classroom atmosphere.
 - Individualized instruction is emphasized.
 - Teachers have a genuine interest in students' lives.
 - UBCS strives for academic excellence. Problem solving and logic are at the heart of class discussions.
 - Approximately 85% of our students go on to college, specialized training institutions, or military service.
 - UBCS utilizes web-based school management software for grades, parent communication, and student attendance.
 - UBCS admits students of any race, color, national, or ethnic origin.
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Pre-Kindergarten and Preschool Center

Facilities

- Children learn in cheerful classrooms.
- Safe, fun and age-appropriate playground provides much enjoyment.
- Wide open spaces give ample room for gross motor-development.



Staff

- Teachers are experienced in teaching and caring for “little” people.
- A genuine love for each individual child is clearly evident.

Academics

- Each class strives for the appropriate level of achievement for each child.
- Bible, art, music, numbers, letters, rhymes, spatial concepts and motor skill exercises are incorporated into the curriculum in addition to history, science and culinary arts.
- Classrooms have a variety of games and toys suited to each age group.
- Playtime is scheduled each day where children learn to play together and share.

Lunch and Snacks

- Children bring their own lunch. Items to be heated up may be sent in to the classroom.
- Children bring their own favorite snacks from home for morning and afternoon snack.

Naps

- Each child has his own mat and blanket for a daily rest period.
- Each infant (6 weeks–15 months) is assigned his/her own crib and provided with linens.

Special Programs

- Several special party days are observed each year. Teachers plan the days to be suitable for their children, often to reinforce ideas being taught in the classroom.
- Pre-Kindergarten students take 2 field trips.
- An annual Information Night/Open House is held for parents to introduce them to their child's next department.
- The Pre-Kindergarten year concludes with a graduation program where the children demonstrate what they have learned.

Home Communication

- Individual teachers prepare reminders of events for their class.
- Daily reports, weekly observations and frequent notes and pictures of students are sent home via a parent communication app.



Elementary (K–4)

Staff

- Well-qualified, dedicated teachers are skillful in handling academics and God's Word to shape lives and character.
- Our dedicated teachers have at least a bachelor's degree and are experienced professionals. Several have advanced degrees.

Textbooks

- Christian textbooks are used on every grade level. Secular textbooks are used occasionally.
- Biblical worldview is integrated into every subject.



Fine Arts Instruction

- Weekly art and general music classes are taught by qualified teachers.
- Students use their talents in Chapel and special programs.
- Christmas and Spring concerts are prepared each year with students performing programs from a Christian perspective.

Physical Education and Related Activities

- Classes are taught by a qualified physical education teacher.
- Basic skills of team sports are taught to prepare for Middle/High School team participation.
- Field Day is held during the last week of school.



Facilities

- Children learn in bright and cheerful classrooms.
- Children play on a blacktop area, in a fenced play ground and in our gym.
 - There are ample areas for soccer, baseball, basketball, tag, and football.

Other Offerings

- Our large library has many books for all age levels. Each class has a weekly library time.
 - Students assemble once a week for Chapel.
 - Students meet weekly for STEM training.
 - *STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) lab allows students to explore and engage in studies about robotics, coding and building. They are able to utilize iPads for STEM.
 - Classes go on special field trips during the year.
 - Every Friday, students take home a Weekly Folder and receive an Activity Sheet containing details about tests, quizzes, projects, etc.
 - Learning Support is available to be a supplemental teaching support to students who require additional help, such as phonics, reading, math, etc. Students meet in groups or one-on-one.
 - Act 89-1975 provides educational assistance for students with a private agency. Students are referred by their teacher, parental consent is secured and an evaluation is made. Reading and Math services are offered.
 - Honor Roll for each academic quarter is rewarded.
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Middle School (5-8) & High School (9–12)

Staff

- Well-qualified, dedicated teachers are skillful in handling academics and God’s Word to shape lives and character.
- Experienced teachers have at least a bachelor’s degree while several have advanced degrees.

Academic Offerings

- Class offerings meet or surpass state graduation requirements.
- Students are provided with a Christ-centered, Biblically integrated curriculum.
- Students have required Bible, English, History, Math, and Science classes.
- Honors classes for core academic subjects are available starting with grade 9.
- AP classes and dual enrollment opportunities are options beginning in grade 11.
- Foreign Language classes are available through Rosetta Stone.
- Microsoft Office classes are available for 9th grade students.
- Health & nutrition are taught in the middle & high school level.
- Art classes and a Yearbook course are offered.
- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) lab allows middle school students to explore and engage in studies about robotics, coding, and building.



Physical Education and Athletics

- Physical Education classes are held for students in Grades 5–12.
- Personal fitness classes are offered for students in Grades 9–12.
- UBCS is a member of the Atlantic Coast Christian Athletic Conference and the Keystone Christian Education Association, sponsoring interscholastic teams in soccer, volleyball, basketball, and baseball.
- Eligibility requirements guard athletes’ academic success.

Facilities

- Timothy Christian Education Center is the home to an art lab, two science labs, a computer lab, a social center/cafeteria, a commercial kitchen, and a large library.
- A full-sized gymnasium, with locker rooms, is equipped with mechanized folding divider to split the gym into two full courts.
- A large athletic field on campus is used for soccer and baseball.
- The Music Center accommodates choral groups.

Other Offerings

- Our library contains books and resources for all age levels.
- Learning Support is available to be a supplemental teaching support to students who require additional help, such as reading, math, etc. Students meet in groups or one-on-one.
- A required Chapel meets twice weekly featuring speakers, testimonies, college-representative and special music.
- General music classes are held for middle school students.
- Students may participate in choir with rehearsals built into class schedules.
- Private piano lessons are available for an additional fee.
- Annual Christmas and Spring concerts provide students with an opportunity to perform in front of an audience.
- Opportunity to participate in Festivals and Fine Arts competitions.
- Full-scale drama performance is produced each year with our students.
- UBCS has an active Honor Society and Student Council giving students opportunities to serve within the school and the local community.



Registration Procedures

Application/References

Fill out completely and return the application and registration fee to the school office. Prospective students may also obtain a copy of the application through our website (www.upperbucks.org) under Admissions. Contact our admissions office at admissions@upperbucks.org with any questions.

- UBCS accepts applications throughout the year.
- Registration of new students for the fall semester begins in late-February.

Records

A copy of the student's most recent achievement test and report card/transcript is required. If the student has been homeschooled, a copy of his/her evaluation and portfolio must be included.

Interview

After the application and records have been received, we will contact you to schedule a family interview with the administrator. The purpose of this meeting is to introduce the student to the administrator and to acquaint the student and parents with the philosophy, codes and procedures of UBCS. The school office will be in contact with you to set up this interview and inform you of the necessary paperwork or documents.

Acceptance

New applicants will be accepted on the basis of a complete review of academic information and a personal interview. A readiness screening is required for Kindergarten students. An entrance test may be required to ensure proper grade and course placement for grades 1-12. The applicant will be informed of their acceptance from the administration. An additional interview may be requested by the administration.

Entrance Requirements

- Parents and students must read the Student Handbook and Statement of Faith.
- School/Parent/Student Agreement must be signed by both parents.
- Secondary students (5th-12th grades) are also required to sign the School/Parent/Student Agreement.
- Proof of immunizations must be provided prior to entrance into the classroom.
- Registration fee is due upon acceptance; no place can be held until the application fee is paid.
